## THE HISTORY OF CANNES

Founded in 997, at the foot of a hill serving as a look-out post for the Seigneury of Rodoard, Cannes began as a small fishing harbour overrun by reeds and known as "Portu Canuae", opposite the Lérins islands that have been known since antiquity as Léro and Lérina.

In 999, one year before the terrible year of 1000, the "Castrum Marcellus" castle was built on the Le Suquet hill. "Portu Canae" had a "khan", a high point in the Celto-Ligurian language, which is the origin of the name Cannes!

From Spanish and Saracen invasions, the 'royal' incarceration of the enigmatic Man in the Iron Mask and the spectacular escape by Marshall Bazaine, the armies of Charles V fighting those of François I, to Napoléon Bonaparte's landing, Cannes was already preparing for its cosmopolitan future...

Cannes became a must-visit destination in 1834! Cannes became well known across the Channel for its mild climate after a former Lord Chancellor, Henry Brougham and Vaux, decided to spend the winter here, a stay that ended up lasting thirty-four years!

Lord Brougham skilfully played the role of ambassador, inviting his friends and relatives to Cannes, and opening the gates of the town to his peers and to kings, queens, princesses, dukes and to the great writers and artists, such as Prosper Mérimée, Guy de Maupassant, Chateaubriand, Victor Hugo, Stendhal, Picabia, and later Renoir, Domerque and Picasso.

This is how the first Autumn-Winter tourist season was born. With paid holidays, this changed to a Spring-Summer touristic season.

## CANNES, CAPITAL OF **ELEGANT SPORTS**

Golf developed around 1890, under the impulse of Grand Duke Michael of Russia, the founder of Cannes Golf Club in Cannes-Mandelieu... Yachting, which arrived a few years earlier under the aegis of the Duke of Vallombrosa, finally achieved recognition here when the Prince of Wales, the future King Edward VII of Great Britain, established the prestigious Royal Regattas that brought the crowned heads of England, Russia, Denmark and Sweden together in the Bay of Cannes. The 20th century transformed the city of Princes into the leading tourism destination on the Côte d'Azur.

### THE CANNES COAT OF ARMS

The coat of arms of Cannes, in azure, silver and gold evokes the town's sky, light and sunshine. Around the year one thousand, Lérins Abbey added two letters to the coat of arms: C for "Canna" [Cannes] and A



for "Abbatia" [Abbey], one "en chief" [the upper left hand section of the coat of arms], and the other "en pointe" [lower right hand section]. This coat of arms remained in place until 1633.

On this date, without having any authority to do so, the consuls of Cannes decided to change the shield by replacing the two letters (C and A) by two fleur de lis, I in honour of the Marquis de Saint Chammond, the governor of Provence's representative. .

The silver palm on an azure background was the emblem of the abbey. Still on the coat of arms today, it is a reference to the palm tree that Saint-Honorat climbed so that the sea could clean the island of serpents.

When the first trains brought Queen Victoria of Great Britain, the Tsarina Maria Alexandrovna of Russia and the Kings and Queens of Sweden, Denmark, Belgium and Spain, Cannes was full of sumptuous palaces, town houses, large luxury hotels and reception venues. La Croisette, then called the Boulevard de l'Impératrice, established itself as a meeting place for society overlooking a stunning bay. Several casinos set the tone for international entertainment which, in addition to the Western aristocracy, attracted an eastern clientele: Maharajahs, Sultans and Emirs. The 1st clay tennis court in France was built in Cannes by Sir Thomas Woolfield, nicknamed the "Marquis de Carabas".



# FROM 1939 TO 2017, THE CANNES FESTIVAL IS CELEBRATING ITS 70TH ANNIVERSARY

At the end of the 1930s, shocked by the interference by the fascist governments in the film selection for the Venice Film Festival, the Americans and British supported the idea of an international cinema festival in France.

Of all the candidate cities (Vichy, Biarritz, Algiers), Cannes won the vote for its 'sunshine and its enchanting setting' as well as for its suitable facilities. Under the chairmanship of Louis Lumière, the inventor of cinema, the 1st Cannes International Film Festival should have taken place between 1 and 20 September 1939.

Its aim was to "encourage the development of the cinematographic art in all its forms and to create a spirit of collaboration between the countries producing films."

It was not until 20 September 1946, in the former Cannes Casino Municipal, that the International Film Festival opened, the first major international cultural event after the war. The first French Palais des Congrès was built in 1947 to host this prestigious event.

During the first years, the Festival was more a touristic or social event, or even an industry gathering than a competition. It quickly became the key event for the film industry and the annual event with the most media coverage, with almost 4000 journalists today.

# LE SUQUET & THE OLD PORT

'Le Suquet' hill is the oldest part of Cannes. We would recommend you start your visit to Cannes with the old town. You can get there from various sides via the steep alleyways, criss-crossed with picturesque, winding steps where pedestrians are kings.

Visit the ramparts, the La Castre Museum, the square tower and the church. Admire the view over the town, the harbour, la Croisette and the Lérins islands. Much of the Bay of Cannes can be found at the foot of the old town, Forville market and its row of food shops (butchers, pork butchers, fishmongers, bakers, wine shops, etc.).

## RUE MEYNADIER

In the stretch from the old town to Le Suquet, the pedestrian Rue Meynadier is a bustling street with food shops, such as the famous cheesemonger, Cénéri, the caterer, Ernest, sweet treats from Jean-Luc Pelé, Provencal specialities, etc. The street is full of many colourful shop window displays.

## THE PALAIS DES FESTIVALS

Its history is closely linked with that of the Film Festival. In order to host this flagship event, a building was erected in 1947 on the Boulevard de la Croisette, the current site of the JW Marriott Hotel. Given the growing success of the Festival and the development of business tourism, in particular with the first MIPTV event in 1965, Cannes decided in 1979 to build a new Palais des Congrès. It now boasts 44,000 m² of exhibition space, 15 auditoria and hosts over 50 international business events and some 300,000 delegates every year, making Cannes the second-largest business tourism destination in France.

# THE WALK OF FAME

Producers, actors and other international celebrities of the silver screen have now left their handprints and signatures for posterity on the Allée des Étoiles du Cinéma, just like at the Chinese Theater on Hollywood Boulevard in Los Angeles.

## THE CARNOT DISTRICT

An original route to explore the architectural splendour of upmarket buildings during the Belle Epoque and the Roaring Twenties.

A succession of apartment blocks, villas and public buildings: in neoclassical, Art Nouveau, eclectic and Art Deco styles, built along a Haussmannian avenue, some 2,600 m long and 25 m wide, built by a subsidiary of Crédit Lyonnais bank and opened in 1883.

## PORT CANTO, PALM BEACH, POINTE CROISETTE

Port Canto was the first private marina in France and remains one of the biggest in Europe. Some beautiful vessels are moored here. Palm Beach was built on the ruins of the La Croix Fort in 1929. It was the venue for great society evenings, attended by King Alfonso XIII of Spain, the Aga Khan, Winston Churchill, etc. The film "Any Number Can Win" by Henri Verneuil (released in 1963) was filmed around the swimming pool. Not far from here you will discover the splendid gardens of the Roseraie [Rose Garden] with play areas for children. From the recently-installed panoramic viewpoint map in the Palm Beach car park, you can admire a unique panorama over St Marguerite Island and the Bay of Cannes. A cross symbolises the location where the first pilgrims took the boat for St Honorat island. On windy days in the off-season, water sports enthusiasts, especially kite-surfers gather here.

## **RUE D'ANTIBES**


Rue d'Antibes is the former imperial road linking Toulon to Antibes. It is the shopping street par excellence. In order to attract the English visitors in the 19th century, several shops were Franco-English, such as the pharmacies, grocers, tailors, etc. Today, the all the major international brands are found here. You can admire the décor, architecture and buildings dating back to the 19th century; beautiful doors bearing the initials of their first owners, ironwork and sculptures by Pellegrini, dating from 1883 (at No. 101), and the former Cannes Theatre with the facades decorated with masks (at No. 104).

Just a stone's throw from La Croisette, opposite the Bay of Cannes, the two Lérins islands are waiting to welcome you.

In an idyllic preserved natural setting, these beauty spots in the Mediterranean offer visitors a unique collection of flora and fauna as well as a singular history combining the mysteries of the Man in the Iron Mask with the tranquillity of Cistercian monks





## SAINT MARGUERITE ISLAND

(900 m wide by 3200 m long)

The first island, Saint Marquerite, is famous for the legend of the Man in the Iron Mask and its Celto-Liqurian, Roman, and medieval remains. Just a short boat trip from Cannes, Saint Marguerite island is an exceptional site where nature, culture and relaxation blend harmoniously. From the moment you disembark, you will notice the fragrances from pine and eucalyptus trees, and the plethora of things to do here. No doubt, the best way to discover its true nature is to walk along the marked trails. This will take you past Batéquier lake nature reserve with its numerous species of migratory birds and Convention Point, where you can discover the different plant species.

## SAINT HONORAT ISLAND

(400 m wide by 1500 m long)

A visit to St Honorat resembles a journey through time. Indeed, here it may well have stopped! Only the modern boats that drop anchor off the coast remind us that we are in the 21st century. The monastery on the island was founded in the 5th century by the monk, Honorat, and it is still the seat of the Lérins Abbev.

Visitors are welcome, and even if meditation is high on the agenda, the monks that live here all year round are very busy producing excellent wines and a liqueur called Lérina. The monastery also runs retreats.

#### WHAT TO SEE

When you tour the island on the Chemin de Ceinture (Coastal path) vou can admire 7 chapels, the vineyard, the religious remains (Entrance gate, statues, etc.), the abbatial church, the fortified monastery (one of the rare examples of a monastery-keep in the West), not to mention a stop at the monastery's souvenir shop to discover the island's produce.



## MUSEUMS AND MONUMENTS

### LA CASTRE MUSEUM

Overlooking La Croisette, the bay and the Lérins islands, La Castre Museum is situated above Old Cannes, in the ruins of the medieval castle of the Lérins monks. Its Square Tower and Saint Anne Chapel are listed historic monuments.

A series of small rooms surrounded by gardens exhibit collections of landscape paintings from the 19th century and objects from Oceania, the Himalayas, the Americas, a wealth of Mediterranean antiquities and Pre-Columbian ceramics.

## MARITIME MUSEUM

The Maritime Museum is in the oldest part of Fort Royal on Saint Marguerite island, a listed historic monument, sitting perpendicular to the sea, on the edge of the pine and eucalyplus forests. You will also be able to visit the State prison and the cell of the Man in the Iron Mask, where the mysterious prisoner was incarcerated for eleven years, plus murals by Jean le Gac and archaeological finds from underwater and on land. ### L'ESPACE MIRAMAR

### LA MALMAISON

Located on La Croisette, the 'La Malmaison Art Centre' now holds four major exhibitions per year, regularly featuring the works of famous painlers such as Chagall, Malisse, Ozenfant or Picasso, forwhom the Côte d'Azur was an endless source of inspiration, as well as internationally renowned artists from the 20th and 21st centuries such as Miró, César, Armand, Clavé and Kijno. ## THE BELLINI CHAPEL AND FIORENTINA PARK

This chapel is part of the Villa Fiorentina estate, the famous Italian-style villa from the end of the 19th century, and just one dwelling among the many that have shaped Cannes. Built in a Baroque style, one side of the chapel bears the coals of arms of Count Vilali, for whom it was built. ### VILLA DOMERGUE

Created in an affluent period, and inspired by the estates that dominate Florence, Villa Domergue stands out as a jewel in the Cannes landscape. Through his work, the artist Jean-Gabriel Domergue was involved in the renewal of the decorative arts in the 20th century. Many ceramic and bronze bowls, collected by the couple during trips around the Mediterranean, decorate the flower beds, transforming this place into an exceptional and magical world. With their sumptuous abode, Odette and Jean-Gabriel Domergue made Cannes the capital of the sumptuous art of living.

The Villa Domergue is open in July and August and during the heritage open days.

### SAINT GEORGE'S CHURCH

A beautiful building from the 19th century, erected in memory of the Duke of Albany, son of Queen Victoria, who died in Cannes. It belonged to the English royal family. You can admire a recumbent marble statue of the Duke and beautiful stained glass windows.

### RUSSIAN CHURCH

The church of Saint Michael the Archangel was erected in 1894, on land donated by Mr and Mrs Tripet-Skrypitzine, the rich landowners who founded the district. It was inaugurated by Grand Duke Michael, the father of Tsar Alexander III. It has pretty icons gifted by the former Russian nobles who overwintered in Cannes.

### FORVILLE MILL

Sculptor and biologist who founded the Provençale Académie in 1919, Victor Tuby amassed a vast collection of Provencal items in this old oil mill. In 1973, it was bequeathed by his widow to the Cannes Scientific and Literature Society, on the sole condition that the site was kept for use as a museum. Since 1993, this museum has been dedicated to Provencal art and traditions.

## **GRAND JAS CEMETARY**

Opened in 1866, the Grand Jas cemetery stretching over nine hectares is unanimously considered as one of the most remarkable cemeteries in France after Père Lachaise (in Paris). Thanks to its location, landscape design, ancient trees and the lush floral decoration, this is a great place for walking and meditation. Let yourself to be guided by the majesty and serenity of the location... ## LA SIAGNE CANAL

The Siagne Canal was built in 1868 to supply the city of Cannes with water. From its source in Saint Cézaire, it winds its way over the gentle slopes of the hinterland and ends its journey in Cannes at the California plateau.

From the edge of Mougins to the Super Cannes observatory, the canal runs underground, thus leaving room for a wide footpath. From the top of Avenue Ziem up to the Route de Vallauris, it is a pleasant walk and offers a view over Cannes that has inspired many an artist. Then from Avenue Bellini, the route crosses a wood where mimosas, giant agave and eucalyptus intermingle, to end on a high point with a stunning view of Palm Beach point and the Lérins islands. For a long time, this was the favourite walk of winter visitors.

Access point: Car park at the top of Avenue Ziem (Pézou roundabout). Duration: 1 hour.

## LA CROIX DES GARDES

Go up Avenue Jean de Noaitles and explore the La Croix des Gardes Natural Forest Park, a listed as a 'Sensitive Natural Area'. La Croix des Gardes is located in the heart of Cannes, less than 1 km from La Croisette as the crow flies. A true green lung offering walkers a 360° panoramic view, the site includes 80 hectares of forest. Along your walk, you will discover the Trail of 5 Belvederes (Le Maquis, Roquebillière, La Croix, Le Cèdre and Brougham), designed to offer you various viewpoints over the Bay of Cannes, its islands, the Estérel mountain range and the Alpine foothills of the Azur. You can also follow the botanical trails, including an arboretum with over 40 varieties of mimosa.

#### THE LOWER SIAGNE VALLEY

A 75-hectare green space dedicated to agriculture and openair leisure activities. 7 hectares are reserved for leisure and relaxation areas (walking or cycling, fishing, discovering the flora and fauna, family picnics, outdoor games, a treetop adventure playground, walks and jogging trails).

Underway: the installation of works of Land Art, a pony club, the creation of an educational farm and 48 new family allotment plots.

## LA CROISETTE

## RUE MEYNADIER

From the 16th century onwards, the 'Rue Grande', or Rue Meynadier, was used by horses or carriages. Today, only pedestrians stroll along this bustling shopping street, where the butcher rubs shoulders with the cheesemonger and fashion pirouettes around local produce. Follow your heart and let yourself be captivated by its charm and enchanted by the sights as you walk towards Le Suguet.

## **RUE D'ANTIBES**

Running parallel to La Croisette, a veritable jewel in the "shopping" crown of Cannes, Rue d'Antibes is notable for its more 'urban' elegance, which recent renovations have helped to increase. It elegantly rivals La Croisette, offering a myriad of 'backdrops' to delight you when shopping: perfume shops, jewellers, florists, high-street fashion boutiques, sweet shops, tea rooms, beauty parlours, interior decoration shops, etc. The best-known brands are here to delight you. Don't forget to stroll around the side streets, where beautiful fashion boutiques and interior decoration shops await you.

Almost all the beaches of Cannes have been awarded the Blue Flag certificate, a gauge of the water quality for swimming. The beaches of Cannes are perfect for whiting away your holiday, thanks to the variety of its facilities and events.
